

Garden Report: November 2020

• Red Oak Health:

 Extension Horticulture Educator Ryan Pankau is finalizing plans to apply mycorrhizae around the Red Oak and is working with F&S. Ryan is also working with Diane Plewa, Extension Plant Diagnostic Outreach Specialist, on securing Cambistat for application in the coming months.

RORG Student Team:

- The RORG Student Team has been active on our social media platforms. Since they began in mid-September, our reach is up 109% on Facebook, up 57% on Instagram, and up 30% on Twitter. The team also created a RORG TikTok account, which has gained us a new audience of several hundred.
- Nina Jurko wrote a popular blog on RORG's edible plants.
- Ariel Gomez helped the team coordinate with UIUC's La Casa Cultural Latina for hit social media posts connecting RORG to Dia de los Muertos through its support of Monarch butterflies, an important cultural symbol of that holiday.

• Monitoring:

- o *CoCoRHaS* rain gauge watchers reported 2.60 inches of rain.
- Soil: Data is being processed from the soil infiltration testing, which was performed by the RORG
 Student Team in September. This data will be included in an upcoming blog post by Layne Knoche.

• Observations of note:

November interest: Smooth Blue Aster, Black Eyed Susan, Yellow Coneflower and 'Rozanne' Geranium
all still had blooms through the middle of the month. Semi-evergreen species such as Pennsylvania
sedge and Common Rush look great. Songbirds are being attracted by the dried seeds of various native
species and the berries of Winterberry and Red Chokeberry.
