- Environmental justice is the fair treatment and meaningful involvement of all people regardless of race, color, national origin, or income, with respect to the development, implementation, and enforcement of environmental laws, regulations, and policies. This goal will be achieved when everyone enjoys:
- The same degree of protection from environmental and health hazards, and
- Equal access to the decision-making process to have a healthy environment in which to live, learn, and work.

- Environmental justice (EJ) is the fair treatment and meaningful involvement of all people regardless of race, color, national origin, or income with respect to the development, implementation and enforcement of environmental laws, regulations and policies.
- Fair treatment means no group of people should bear a disproportionate share of the negative environmental consequences resulting from industrial, governmental and commercial operations or policies.
- Meaningful involvement means:
- People have an opportunity to participate in decisions about activities that may affect their environment and/or health;
- The public's contribution can influence the regulatory agency's decision;
- Community concerns will be considered in the decision making process; and
- Decision makers will seek out and facilitate the involvement of those potentially affected.

Local EJ Issue: Asphalt Plant in Urbana Neighborhood

- EPA sent a note to city official in Urbana when the asphalt plant in East Urbana applied for a permit.
- East Urbana is in a designated Environmental Justice Zone
- Urbana held a meeting with the EPA & Asphalt Plant.

Local EJ Issue: Coal Ash polluting Vermillion River https://ecojusticecollaborative.org/why-the-middle-fork/


Dynagy to remove 3.3 Million Cubic Yards of coal ash along the Vermillion River. Took years of community organizing, tons of meetings. Tenacity. Buckets of public input. 300 people at a public hearing. Petitions. Pressure on the state legislature to protect the river. And more.



Total Campus Greenhouse Gas Emissions






